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ANTIQUE STAIN

Your satisfaction is important to us, and we want you to be fully informed about the characteristics of this finish.

The antique stain finish is a paint and stain combination that will give you a weathered appearance. The stain is applied over paint, then wiped off by hand, creating lighter and darker areas on the door. The stain technique will give each cabinet its own unique look, with no two doors being the same. This variation is not considered a defect and will not be reason for replacement.

The wood species available with antique stain are Rustic Beech, Birch, Rustic Birch and White Oak. Rustic woods may contain natural sound defects and possess all inherent characteristics of the species. Minimal to no color or grain matching is done to preserve strong character. Some of the characteristics that may be represented are mineral streaks, pecks, burls, natural color variations, grain variations and naturally occurring tight, open and cracked knots. Open knots will be structurally 'sound' and will not be seen through. The amount, size and placement of natural characteristics will vary, and the consistency (or lack of) is not considered cause for replacement. Dark paints may reduce the appearance of the rustic characteristics. We do not guarantee that each piece will have rustic characteristics.

On wood products, movement is typical due to changes in climate conditions. This may cause the hairline cracks at the stiles, rails and joints that you will see in a painted finish. Panel shrinkage may also occur in the door panel of your cabinetry. Over time, there may be a slight color change in this finish due to exposure to natural and artificial light. You may see some wood grain telegraph through the paint finish, especially in Oak.

We would also recommend purchasing a sample door in the door style, wood species and finish that will be purchased for your home, even though one sample door will not accurately portray the variance in a room with multiple cabinets.
